Plant of the Month

Saxifraga

For many years Alison and I have enjoyed growing Saxifraga. These alpine ground covering plants create a cushion of flowers at this time of year. We have several colours in stock from white, to light pink and deep pink. All priced at a very reasonable £3.00.

Saxifraga are the largest sub species of the genus Saxifragaceae. Mainly grown in the northern hemisphere and enjoying alpine conditions. The Latin word Saxifraga means "Stone Breaker". It is thought that the plants may have medicinal properties in helping break down kidney stones. Although, we would obviously not recommend trying this.

Saxifraga can tolerate both sunny and partial shady positions. They are a fully hardy perennial which means they will last for many years. They are ideal in alpine gardens and rockeries, although we do use them at the front of a mixed border. The flowering period



is from March to April. They work well when planted alongside Aubrietia — another ground covering plant which flowers at this time of year.

Try growing Saxifraga to enhance rockeries, alpine beds and at the front of perennial borders.
