In store we continue to look at ways of reducing packaging and plastic use. You will notice that when we present you with new keys in our key cutting area that these are now no longer placed into plastic sealable bags. Paper bags are now used for this purpose.

The main political event at the end of January will be our exit from the EU. Yes we have had the chance to forget about this a bit over Christmas. I am convinced that the degree of uncertainty that Brexit has brought has had an impact of consumer spending. After all, we have all wondered if prices will increase, will there be an impact on employment etc. I am hopeful that as the reality of Brexit now comes upon us that we will see a return of consumer confidence, which could see an increase in house sales. This in turn usually helps to stimulate many other aspects of our economy. As a retailer I would remain hopeful that this could help encourage improvements in the DIY and gardening sectors which have been particularly affected by the economy over the past few years.

As we move towards the end of the year I do suspect that we will see further developments towards a more environmentally sustainable Christmas. Last year we witnessed many improvements in environmentally sensitive wrapping papers, ribbons and crackers. It can only get better as consumer awareness of these important environment concerns continues to improve and manufacturers find viable alternatives.

Sow different crops at different times to get a longer harvesting season.


